Term: 2

Meeting Actions	Who and by when
Find out what other children feel is important : The group discussed ways to better understand what other pupils in the school feel passionate about. Surveys, class discussions, and suggestion boxes were suggested as methods to gather feedback. A school-wide survey will be created to gather students' opinions on various topics, and results will be reviewed in the next meeting.	Pupil parliament - G
Identify Charities to Support: The group discussed which charities they would like to support throughout the year. After some suggestions, it was agreed that the Wallace and Gromit Grand Appeal charity would be the first to receive support from the school. This charity supports children with brain injuries and their families.	LD
Pupil Play Leaders to be Set Up (Suggested by Year 5 Pupils) Year 5 pupils proposed setting up a play leader scheme to support younger pupils during playtimes, helping with games and social interactions.	JCooke

Outcomes following the meeting:

- Pupil Parliament children surveying pupil voice at break and lunch times.
- School to join Superkind Programme – Children to launch in January with Mrs Horder as teacher leader
- School to join 'Grand Appeal' – School to budget £1000 to purchase two 'Norbots'
- The play leader scheme has been identified. A staff leader for the program has been appointed. Pupils were informed and invited to apply for the role. Training will be provided to the selected pupils in three phases. Resources for the scheme, such as equipment and materials, have been purchased, and sessions are set to begin after Christmas.
- A performance date has been set, and children will sing at the local shopping centre in December. The school choir will also perform at the Christmas fair, bringing festive cheer to the community.
